## Medicines

If it is ever necessary for your child to have medication in school, the school procedure is set out below.

Medicines must be handed into a member of staff at the school office (or nursery) where a 'medicine in school form' will be completed. Written permission must be given by a parent / carer. Only prescribed medicine can be administered. Medicine must be clearly labelled with child's name and the dosage. Every time medicine is administered the date and time are recorded on a record sheet which the parent/carer must sign at the end of the day.

Asthma inhalers should be kept by the children and be kept with them at all times. They must accompany the child to PE and swimming lessons. No throat or cough sweets are allowed in school at any time.

**6C with 100%**


**5S with 99.6%**
