Welcome back to the final half term of the school year. We hope that everyone has a good half term week and have been able to enjoy the great weather we have been having.

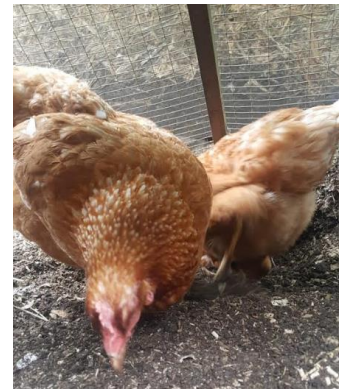

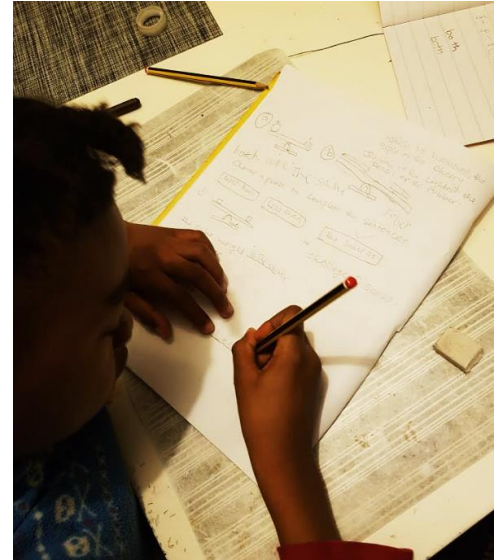
Home learning




7 What is one-third of 30 millilitres (ml)?
