## Manchester City Council Emergency Helpline

A new freephone helpline to support the most vulnerable people in Manchester during the Coronavirus pandemic will go live from 8.30am on Monday 30<sup>th</sup> March 2020 and this will sit alongside our comprehensive online portal [www.manchester.gov.uk/coronavirus](http://www.manchester.gov.uk/coronavirus) where people can access up to date information immediately.

Help will also be available, but not limited to, other groups such as carers, care leavers or young carers.

The primary needs that call handlers can help with are:

- Delivery of food
- Delivery of medication
- Combating loneliness
- Managing fuel top-up payments




Noemi in 3G has been really busy creating her rainbow of hope, completing lots of maths work and polishing up on her gymnastics skills. Keep up the great work Noemi!

Natalia in 1H really enjoys learning outdoors and has had a brilliant time in her garden making bubbles for her family to enjoy.




Chloe in 1H has been putting her fantastic writing skills into practise and has created a short story as well as getting involved in some Easter crafts.




Lilly in 2P is busy at home learning to tell the time on an analogue clock. She has even made her own; keep up the great work Lilly.




Desmond in 4S has been working extremely hard in maths and has worked through his entire times tables. Well done Desmond!

Melissa in 3G has made a fantastic 'rainbow of hope' flag to display in her home! You have done an amazing job Melissa!


Ellis in 2J has been busy in the kitchen making chocolate Rice Krispy cakes. They look delicious Ellis.
