


Safer Learning

Shahd in 3G has created a fantastic 'Thank you' poster for NHS staff while at home. Maybe you could make one too? What a thoughtful idea Shahd.


Ebanehita in 6C has been busy completing her home learning tasks in science. She has created a fantastic double page spread on the immune system. This is excellent Ebanehita!



Jasmine in 3H has been hard at work crafting a paper star and a pompom unicorn. They both look fantastic Jasmine!




Ryley, Denley and Reggie have been putting their art skills to good use, creating colourful pictures to put in their window. Keep up the great work boys!






Isla Rose in 1C has been making pancakes with her big sister Isabelle in 6C. Great team work girls, your pancakes look delicious!





Maisie in 3T has been working hard practising her spellings at home. Well done Maisie, you are doing a great job!




Wisdom in 2P has mastered his home learning spellings and has been practising daily. Keep up the great work!
