Dear families,

We hope everyone has managed to have a happy and safe half term. We are looking forward to welcoming more children back into school tomorrow who have been invited to return. You should have received an email detailing all of the necessary information.

Please make sure that you know which bubble your child is in and which door they should enter so that children can be dropped off promptly. Members of the SLT will be outside to assist families at drop-off and pick-up times should you require any assistance.

Children do not need to bring any special resources, bags or water bottles into school, just their packed lunch if they usually have one. Any books that children have finished reading can be brought into school.

We would like to take this opportunity to remind you of our school expectations in order to keep everyone as safe as possible when entering the school site. These include:

- Using the designated entry and exit gates.
- Following the arrows showing a one-way system when entering and exiting the school grounds.
- Not entering the main office at this time.
- Standing in the designated waiting areas at pick up times.
- Socially distance at all times – at least 2m apart.
- Be on time when dropping off and picking up.
- Leave the premises promptly after drop-off and collection times.
- Wherever possible, only one family member to collect children.
- Please do not allow any children to play in the MUGA or any play areas including the nursery.

We would request that all adults continue to follow these guidelines and work with us to keep everyone as safe as possible.

We have also attached the Covid Rules Home School Agreement to read and discuss with your children before they return tomorrow. This is a reminder about how to keep themselves and others safe whilst in school and it is important that children follow these rules at all times.

We appreciate the start of the 2020/21 school year has been difficult for many. Children may, like you, feel anxious or frustrated by the present situation but we hope that returning to school eases any concerns and children can start to enjoy their learning back in the school environment.
